1. Registration

Registration for the Summer 2025/26 season opens August 2025.

Numbers are capped for each age group due to limited training venue availability and coaching resources. Once the maximum number of registrations have been met for each group, you will be unable to register and your child will be placed on a waiting list. We strongly recommend that you register as soon as you can.

Fees are payable at the time of registration.

Maccabi Basketball Victoria reserves the right to accept or reject any participant's registration.

IMPORTANT: Please check the below sections, 2. Competition Information and 4. Age Eligibility for Waverley and McKinnon - Summer season, before registering to ensure you register for the correct competition. For those that register in the wrong competition, you may incur additional fees to fix this error including club administration fees, PlayHQ fees and McKinnon spectator fees.

Use your email address and the password you created to set up your Play HQ account for last season. If you have forgotten your password use the forgotten link to reset your password.

3. Competition Dates

Waverley Competition

The Summer season commences the Saturday 11th / Sunday 12th October and concludes with the Grand Final to be played late March. Season duration 16 weeks plus 2 weeks of finals. The first 5 matches are grading games.

The Tuesday night competition begins earlier on Tuesday 7th October and concludes with the grand final to be played on 31st March 2026. Season duration is 16 weeks plus 2 weeks of finals. The first 5 matches are grading games.

Teams will start training week beginning Monday the 6th October 2025. A detailed calendar will be available on the Club's website.

McKinnon Competition

The Summer season commences Saturday 11th / Sunday 12th October and concludes with the Grand Final to be played mid March. Season duration is 15 weeks plus 2 weeks of finals. The first 4 matches are grading games.

Teams will start training week beginning Monday the 6th October 2025. A detailed calendar will be available on our website.

McKinnon Midweek Competition - U8/U10

The Summer season commences Wednesday 8th October and concludes with the Grand Final to be played at the end of March. Season duration is 18 weeks plus 2 weeks of finals. The first 4 matches are grading games.

Teams will start training week beginning Monday the 6th October 2025. A detailed calendar will be available on our website.

4. Age Eligibility for Waverley and Mckinnon - Summer Season

Age eligibility has changed for Waverley for Summer 2025/26. This may mean that your child will be playing in an age group higher, but please note they are in the same situation as the majority of children in their current year level, and will not be disadvantaged in any way.

5. Training Times and Venues

Each team trains once a week. As a general rule, the following training nights will be allocated for each group:

- Boys: Monday or Tuesday night
- Girls: Wednesday or Thursday night

Please understand that with 80+ teams entered each season, catering to each child's (or parent's) preferred training venue or day is impossible. Therefore, once teams are announced **NO REQUESTS** for training day changes will be considered due to a clash with other sports/activities. When you register a player you are agreeing to the training days specified above and any requests for specific training days are not guaranteed.

Final training days and times will be determined by the following factors (in order of priority):

- Availability of coaches
- Availability of venues
- Availability of players

Training venues (subject to change):

If you are requesting a specific day for training, please note this can affect your child's team placement.

TRAINING VENUE AND/OR DAY REQUESTS ARE NOT GUARANTEED.

Refunds will not be provided for participants not placed in their team of choice.

Player Commitment

Once a player registers for a season, he/she makes a commitment to be reliable and attend all training sessions and games for their team, unless for some unforeseen circumstance, such as sickness, injury or a special family function. Choosing to play another sport where it is known that training or game times conflict with basketball commitments is not an acceptable reason for absence. Unreliable players may be penalised at the coach's discretion by reduced court time.

A player should notify their Team Manager as soon as they become aware that they will be unavailable for a particular training session or a game.

By registering for consideration into a team, parents agree to committing to the team and training time/venue allocated.

6. Coaches

All Maccabi coaches hold a current Working With Children Check and are constantly upskilling through Basketball Victoria accreditation and development sessions run by our Coaching Directors during the season. Within our coaching group we have some parent coaches/assistant coaches.

We also utilise a volunteer parent Back Up Coach system to assist when coaches are unavailable. You can volunteer to be a Back Up Coach when registering your player.

7. Club Membership Fees - SUMMER SEASON 2025/26

Fees are set out below. Please note, Basketball Victoria charges an annual fee of \$29 (17 and under) and \$43 (18 and up) for every player. If you paid this fee last season you will not be required to pay it again this season. Play HQ will automatically add it to your registration fee if you are required to pay it this season.

8. Withdrawal from season.

Refund Policy

When a player withdraws after registering, it causes significant disruption not only to individual teams but also to the entire age group, placing a substantial burden on the volunteers within our committee and the head coaches. The registration fees are designed to encompass expenses related to coaching, venue rental for training, registration and game related costs, insurance, administration and other miscellaneous expenditures. Refunds are only considered by the Club under exceptional and rare circumstances (and will incur a minimum \$100 on cost)

Refunds are not given for:

- Dislike of the team into which the player has been selected
- Dislike of the allocated coach
- Unavailability to train at the allocated time/day
- Preferences not being met e.g. not playing with friends
- Dislike of the team's allocated division/grade
- Other sport/social/work commitments of the player
- Change of mind by player/parents

The Club may consider refunds where a player is injured for a substantial part or the whole of the season. The amount of this refund is at the discretion of the Club, and is also subject to a \$100 administration charge. From Summer 2025/26, an injury related refund will only be provided as a credit to be applied to a future season.

9. Inclusion/ Financial Assistance

Maccabi Basketball believes that every Jewish child has the right to play basketball and will ensure financial assistance is available for registration if needed. Assistance may be accessed via the Maccabi Relief Fund.

The application process is confidential and simple. Maccabi Victoria will attempt to resolve all requests for assistance within 2-5 days.

10.Uniform

This season, our club is introducing a new compulsory playing uniform for all players. As part of this change, every member—new and returning—must purchase the new uniform (singlet and shorts).

- The Uniform is automatically included in the price of registration for Summer 2025/2026 during the registration period
- Uniforms are included at a heavily subsidised rate during the registration period which
 is below the Club's cost price, thanks to a grant obtained with the assistance of
 Maccabi Victoria for this purpose.
- All players must place their uniform order during this registration window.
- If you register after the registration period closes, you will still be required to purchase the uniform, at the full, unsubsidised cost.

Please ensure your registration is completed on time to take advantage of the discounted pricing.

Uniform items can be purchased via the Club's online store https://www.maccabibasketball.com.au/uniforms and /or during registration via Play HQ.

Consider the size your child requires when ordering so they will at least get a couple of seasons out of it. Sizes are in children's sizes and true to size. If unsure what size your child needs, choose a size up.

Please ensure that all uniform orders are placed during registration. We cannot guarantee availability of uniforms if orders are placed after registrations are closed.

For this season uniforms will be available for pick up on uniform collection day/s - dates and locations to be advised closer to the time. If you miss the collection days - the only way to get your uniform will be via delivery.

If you feel you would prefer to have your uniform shipped or you will not be here close to the start of the season then please consider the \$12 shipping option.

If you have an old uniform you no longer use please consider donating it to the Regan Milestone Foundation - a collection bin is located at the Maccabi Victoria Offices.

We use the WhatsApp Community function to communicate news, updates and information. Your Team Manager (TM) will set up a WhatApp group specifically for your team and will use Polls or Events to confirm attendance to games and training.

Please note - no child under the age of 18 is allowed to join the WhatsApp chat with their coach or other adults on the chat without one of their parents also being included on the chat.

12. Player Grading and Team Selection

Team placement for the new season is determined through a comprehensive process that considers several factors. Returning players are observed multiple times throughout the season where possible by lead and head coaches either during games or training sessions. This is in addition to receiving feedback from their current coach. Coaches provide regular feedback about both individual and team performance to the coaching panel throughout the season via weekly coaching reports. Each coach compiles a season summary of a players performance based around specific criteria containing both skill development/execution as well as attitudinal competencies. If a player has been identified as a candidate for movement, then a lead/head coach will also have viewed this individual for assessment. Movement will also occur due to age restrictions whereby players move into the next age category. Any new players to the club will have an in person skills session with a lead/head coach to determine the appropriate placement. Where plausible most teams will have continuity of playing group unless a player has been identified as requiring specific movement to enhance the development of their skills and confidence or are no longer the eligible age.

Graded Club Policy

One of Maccabi Basketball Victoria's founding principles is that we are a Graded Club. By registering your child with Maccabi Basketball Victoria, you agree to this Grading Policy.

Why Maccabi is a Grading Club

The club's philosophy is that grading is the fairest way to ensure that players of varying abilities play with and against others of similar skills. This approach optimises your child's involvement, contribution to the team, and skill development.

When players of widely different abilities are placed on the same team, it can lead to frustration for both higher and lower skilled players, benefiting neither in the long run. This environment may cause players to become disheartened and lose self-esteem.

Players placed on teams beyond their ability will struggle to develop when overshadowed by more talented teammates. Conversely, stronger players won't reach their full potential if placed on a lower level team just to stay with a friend.

Grading ensures a better team fit, increased individual confidence, and a more constructive learning experience. Players, and parents, tend to enjoy the game more when playing at the right level. Grading also allows coaches to better meet development needs during training because players will have similar skill sets.

Our aim is for every player at the club to train and play at a level most appropriate for their development needs.

Friendships

While Maccabi Basketball's priority is to be a graded club, we do consider friendships where possible. We consider ourselves to be in a fortunate position, whereby the entire club is one community, therefore, every player is a potential friend and new social connection. This enables our families to broaden their social circles and develop stronger links in the community.

To consider friendships, they must be identified during the player registration process. You will be able to nominate two friends that your player would like to be in a team with. Friends nominated must be of a similar ability. Please note that when considering friendship requests, significant differences in skill level between nominated friends, as assessed by the coaching panel, is deemed counter productive to the clubs grading policy and, therefore, might not be accommodated. **Only reciprocal friend requests made during registration will be considered.** Late friend requests after team selections will not be accommodated due to the impact on team numbers across multiple teams and families.

How reciprocal friendship requests works, for example:

Moshe requests Noah and Noah requests Moshe - Reciprocal

Miriam requests Dina BUT Dina does not request Miriam - Not reciprocal

Large friend groups or significant differences in skill levels may not be accommodated, as this could compromise player development and other players' opportunities. The club is committed to maintaining the integrity of the grading process and ensuring fairness for all players.

While we understand that parents make decisions based on the best interests of their children, the club must also consider the broader playing group within the age category.

Although this may mean that children won't always play with their friends, experience has shown that they quickly form new friendships and bonds with their new teammates.

Refunds will not be provided for participants not placed in their team of choice.

New Player Tryouts

For all new players - an assessment session will be held prior to the Summer 2025/26 Season.

If you are a new player U10 (U8 players are placed mainly on a social criteria and therefore do not need to attend try outs) or above who has previously played basketball at another club or with Maccabi more than 1 season ago, please note this when registering and you will be invited to attend a training session for assessment so that you can be best placed with a team of similar ability.

The Coaching Directors undertake the complex task of combining all players within an age group into the most appropriate teams that will play in graded competitions for the upcoming season.

Teams are selected by our coaching group based on the following criteria:

- Player ability grading skill level, attitude, motivation (based on try-outs and the coaches grading process)
- Team balance mix of offensive and defensive abilities making a well rounded team

• Friendships - for those wanting to play socially, reciprocal requests can be made via registration, however this will be considered with the above criteria and is at the total discretion of the club.

Refunds will NOT be provided for participants not placed in their team of choice.

Once your child's team placement and lists are finalised - no movements are permitted.

13. Team Managers

Team Manager is a critical role and no team can play without one. **Please consider volunteering for this role**, your kids will love seeing you involved and you are making a fantastic contribution to our club which relies on our wonderful volunteers to operate smoothly.

It is essential that one parent performs the role of Team Manager for each team. This involves:

- Facilitating communication within your team
- Scheduling training and creating a parent roster for training supervision
- Scheduling match day events and rostering parents for scoring

This is a simple but essential role that requires minimal time but makes an enormous difference to your child's team for the season. It is a condition of registration that you agree to accept the responsibility of being a Team Manager if you are chosen. Team Managers are allocated each season on a rotational basis (unless there is a volunteer).

Please do not email the club saying you are unable to be a Team manager. You have agreed to it as part of the T&Cs in registering your child. If you cannot fulfil your Team Manager duties it is your responsibility to find a parent from your team to replace you.

Training cannot commence without a parent supervision roster in place for training.

We have a dedicated volunteer who assists Team Managers to fulfil their roles. Please contact info@maccabibasketball.com.au if you require any assistance.

14. Announcement of Teams

Please be patient. Team allocation is a timely process. A number of factors are taken into consideration to determine teams. You will receive notification via Stack Team App when the teams have been released. Only those that have registered for the season will receive a notification.

Prior to filming, please inform all teams that you will be filming and your intention to do so. Eg. Training purposes/Keepsake etc.

** Should any person take objection to the photographing or filming, they should be asked the reason why they object. It should be explained to them that the Basketball Victoria Photography/Filming Policy permits the creation of content for organisational and individual use. However, if the person objecting has a legitimate and strong reason why the objection is made, then a bar should be placed on that content. A strong reason may include a child safety exemption whereby the child concerned is the subject of contested custody proceedings or has been the subject of violence or threats and publication of a video or photograph may compromise the safety of the child.

We expect that all communication towards each other is carried out in a polite manner. If there are any issues, please address these with the venue manager at the stadium.
